To all to whom these presents shall

(Ex. v) come greeting: know ye; That by virtue of a Land
office Treasury warrant number seven thousand, four
hundred and forty four, issued the twentieth day of October,
seventeen hundred and eighty one, there is granted by the
said Commonwealth, unto William Herralde, a certain tract
or parcel of Land, containing twelve acres, by survey bearing
date, the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight
hundred and eight, lying and being in the county of
Wythe, on the waters of New river and bounded as followeth,
to wit: Beginning at two white oaks corner to his own
land, thence north sixty degrees, east thirty two poles to a
large white oak on the north side of a hill, thence
north twenty degrees, west sixty six poles to a
white oak, black oak and hickory sapling on the south
side of ridge, south fifty three degrees, west forty poles
to a black oak on a line of his own land and thence
south sixty nine degrees, ^{East sixty poles} to the beginning, with its
appurtenances; To have and to hold the said
tract of Land with its appurtenances, to the said William
Herralde and his heirs forever. In witness whereof
the said John Tyler, Esquire, Governor of the Commonwealth
of Virginia, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the lesser
seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond, on the
tenth day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight
hundred and nine, and of the Commonwealth the thirty-fourth.
